

## AIRSTREAM WARRANTY 1969 MODEL YEAR

The Airstream Warranty applies only to the original owner and the applicable date of all warranties is that indicated on the owner's I.D. Card. (Owner's Identification)

Under the terms of this warranty, the metal shell, frame, axle and axle assembly to and including the spindle are covered under the Lifetime portion to be free of defects in material and workmanship.

The metal shell includes the exterior aluminum skin, the structural members or bows (sometimes referred to as ribs) between the skins and the inside vinyl skin. Windows, ceiling vents and access doors are not considered a part of the metal shell.

The frame is the welded steel framework supporting the floor and the "A" frame section sometimes referred to as the tongue. The coupler and hoist or jack post are not considered a part of the frame and are not covered under the Lifetime portion of this warranty.

The axle and axle assembly are the square tube, mounting plates, trailing arms and spindle. The hubs, drums, brake assemblies and shock absorbers are not considered a part of the axle assembly.

Wheel alignment and/or abnormal tire wear are not covered by warranty. The Airstream axle is manufactured to a tolerance of  $1^{\circ}$  or  $1/8"$  on both toe-in and camber and these tolerances will only change if the trailer is subjected to abuse such as dropping off a sharp berm, striking a curb or hitting a deep hole in the road. Such damage would be considered as resulting from an accident which risks are not covered under the warranty. Tires are excluded from this warranty and will be adjusted or replaced according to the terms of their manufacturer. The tire warranty is against defects in material and workmanship only, and does not cover road hazards.

Batteries are warranted by their manufacturer for a period of 90 days unconditionally and pro-rata for 24 months. Battery manufacturers maintain that defects such as a shorted cell will be detected within a 90 day period and thereafter a \$2.25 per month pro-rata charge will cover the actual usage received. To clarify a point, any defective battery will be replaced free until the 90th day, but thereafter the pro-rate charge reverts to date of purchase. If it occurs at the end of 120 days the replacement charge is \$9.00.

Damage to enameled or porcelain surfaces resulting from abrasion or blows is the result of accident or abuse and not covered by warranty. Window glass breakage and what is termed by the automotive industry as "mysterious explosion" is covered by the Comprehensive Clause of most Insurance Companies.
