ACRYLIC COATING -(Exterior)

(The age of the coating has a great deal to do with STRIPPING the method used.)

A. New trailer to 9-months old.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

- A. Clean warm water
- B. Soft rags (diapers or T-shirt material)
- C. Lacquer thinner
- D. Paper and masking tape

B. Procedure

- 1. Wash panel to be stripped with warm water to remove dust and dirt. Chora Fred Fred
- 2. Dry the panel.
- 3. Wash off coating with lacquer thinner.
 - (A) Can use a 50-50 mix of acetone & toloul.
 - (B) Can use Xylol
- 4. Be sure not to get thinner on surrounding panels.
- 5. After removed of all material from panel, clean with thinner, rag wrung out.
- 6. Mask around perimeter of panel being refinished.

C. EQUIPMENT

- 1. Use equipment capable of spraying enamel.
- 2. If equipment is to small it will require additional thinning of material and the necessity of extra coats being applied.
- 3. Cup gun can be used successfully.
- 4. Recommended binks #7, if a cup, use 36SD air nozzle, #36 fluid nozzle and 36 needle.

The paper must be removed as quickly as possible so CAUTION the sprayed material won't soak through the paper and cause it to stick to the surrounding panels.

5. On pressure pot with binks #7, you can use 36 needle, 36 fluid tip and 33PE air nozzle.
